Though the work of Christar has gone by different names and varying organizational seasons over the past 115 years, we celebrate that our mission endures—faithfully pursued by our mobilization center staff, global workers, faithful supporters and sending church partners. To God be the glory!

This past year was marked by numerous Christar leadership transitions, including the end of Dr. Steve Coffey's service as Christar's U.S. director and my assumption of this role in July 2024. We praise God that Steve continues to minister through Christar as global ministries pastor. Richard Barron retired after decades of service as the finance director and treasurer of Christar U.S., and Jared Gray stepped into these roles. In addition, Brent McHugh resigned as the Christar International director, with Daniel Bethel succeeding him in this position.

As the new U.S. director, I recognize that I stand on the shoulders of generations of sacrificially committed servants who have faithfully fulfilled this calling before me. A common strategy among incoming organizational leaders is to avoid changing anything for at least a year. However, such sentiments do not easily mesh with the innovative culture and pioneering spirit of Christar! Therefore, a few months after stepping into my new role, I facilitated a strategic ministry planning process called StratOp with Christar U.S. leaders.

The mission of Christar U.S. is "to manifest the excellencies of Christ in our service to our global co-workers, local churches and the least-reached." Considering this, we prayerfully developed a mission-aligned vision called "ADVANCE '28." I encourage you to read more about it and learn how you can get involved on the back panel of this report.

As we do our best to honor our past, we are also working hard to advance the mission of Christar into the future. Thank you for praying with and for us! Christar Summit: Unity Unleashed

On November 1-2, 2024, we gathered nearly 100 missions-minded believers, business leaders, church representatives, cross-cultural workers and mission organization representatives with a singular goal: accelerate the spread of the gospel to the least-reached. Together, we prayed, worshiped, explored innovative solutions, collaborated around creative ideas and fostered new partnerships.

These two days served as a springboard for moving forward together. Since the summit, we've been encouraged to see numerous participants take significant steps in pursuing Great Commission involvement and collaboration:

- Three people are taking vision trips to explore opportunities for long-term service.
- Churches throughout the U.S. have expressed interest in a local summit in their region.
- Believers are giving their time and expertise as virtual volunteers, and three business projects received feedback and assistance.
- Collaboration across organizations is taking place through connections made at the summit.

We're deeply grateful for all who invested time, energy and ideas in the summit, and we came away with eager anticipation of what the Lord is doing through His people.

ADVANCE '28

In October 2024, Christar U.S. leaders met to participate in a strategic ministry planning process called StratOp, which resulted in a fresh three-year vision, known as ADVANCE '28, along with corresponding strategies and initiatives.

By the end of 2028, we desire to see:

- 200 new and vetted aspiring cross-cultural workers
- 100 donors directly supporting the ministry of Christar U.S.
- 50 churches increasing their active involvement with Christar
- \$1,000,000 annual increase in general fund revenues of Christar U.S.

To accomplish this vision, we identified the following five core strategies:

- 1. Elevate our local church engagement
- 2. Improve our internal communication
- 3. Align to industry best practices
- 4. Increase the U.S. mobilization center's resources
- 5. Optimize our collaboration with Christar International
