THE BARNABAS BUILDING



In a South Asian community with no known followers of Jesus, Christar workers Ravi and Amy* were eager to see the gospel take root. In 2019, a gift from their sending church enabled them to buy land, opening opportunities to use this new space to host events in the village.

As relationships flourished, Ravi and Amy saw an opportunity to invest in the community by constructing a permanent building. Such a space could function as a ministry hub, an educational center and a gathering place for future believers. It would also include living space for their family, demonstrating to the village their intention of long-term investment and integration within the community.

This ministry hub is becoming a reality through the investment of many members of the Body of Christ. Gifts from several churches, a Christian foundation and 18 individuals covered the cost of labor and supplies. Hundreds of people covered the project, laborers, land and ministry with prayer. A team from Ravi and Amy's sending church came to help with construction of a library and provide encouragement. Another church took a Christmas offering especially for the Barnabas Building, and together, that congregation sent over \$140,000 that paid for much of the flooring and finishing work to make the space usable.

Ravi and Amy have seen the first fruits of transformation. In late 2023, a young man in this community trusted in Christ! People around the world are praying that he is the first of many who will put their faith in Christ, gather in worship, flourish in faith and bring forth a bountiful harvest of Christ-followers, where before there were none.

Jim was drawn to Christar's pioneering spirit and commitment to building the Body of Christ among the not-yet Church. Both Jim and his wife, Kari, were raised in Iowa, where they met in high school youth group. After completing a Bachelor of Science in intercultural studies at Baptist Bible College, he and Kari spent a decade doing pioneering work in Siberia among predominantly Buddhist people groups. When their visas were not renewed, they left behind leaders as well as a church-planting movement that continues.

After leaving Russia, they continued ministry to Russian-speakers and others in arctic regions, serving from Alaska. Jim served as a field director for two organizations, outreach director for Alaska's largest church and for another church in South Dakota. For the past decade, he has served as regional president of Converge Heartland, overseeing churches from North Dakota to Oklahoma, revitalizing many and guiding them into more active mobilization and engagement with pioneer missions.

Jim holds graduate diplomas in Russian language and exegetical theology and a master's degree in health service administration.
